Re: Port Credit & Mineola Community Workshops

We are pleased to invite you to attend a community workshop hosted by the Cities of Mississauga and Brampton to seek your input on the Hurontario / Main Street Study.

The Port Credit & Mineola Community Workshop is being held on October 30, 2008 between 6:00 pm and 9:00 pm at Clarke Memorial Hall on 161 Lakeshore Road West. The workshop is opened to the public.

The Hurontario / Main Street Study is examining how rapid transit service could operate along the Hurontario Street and Main Street corridor between the Port Credit area and the GO Station in downtown Brampton. The feasibility study began in May and is anticipated to wrap up next June. Improving transit service is one element of this important study. Other components include:

- Developing appropriate land uses and urban design policies and initiatives to support rapid transit service;
- Identifying potential social, economic and environmental impacts of various rapid transit routes and technologies; and,
- Ensuring that residents and stakeholders play an active role in shaping the future of the corridor.

Recognizing the distinct features of the communities along Hurontario and Main Street, we are hosting a total of five workshops in five locations along the corridor—including this

workshop in the Port Credit and Mineola area. The purposes of the workshop are to:

- Obtain your comments on land use, transportation and urban design issues that pertain to your community
- Bring out your ideas on the proposed rapid transit options; and
- Identify potential challenges and opportunities your community faces relative to operating rapid transit service along Hurontario Street and Main Street.

Staff from the Cities of Mississauga and Brampton, as well as the project consultant (MMM Group) will facilitate this workshop. They will also be available to discuss issues relevant to your community and answer questions.
